



Cutting

Finished Size: 55" x 55"

Fabrics 1-13

From each Fat Quarter Cut
(3) 5-1/2" **A** squares

From the following Fat Quarters also cut:

Fabrics 1, 2, 3, 12

Cut (2) 2-1/2" x 9" **B** rectangles

Fabrics 4, 8, 13

Cut (4) 2-1/2" x 9" **B** rectangles

Fabrics 7, 10

Cut (2) 2-1/2" x 11" **C** rectangles

Fabric 14 - Background

Cut (4) 2-1/2" x WOF strips into
(52) 2-1/2" **D** squares

Cut (2) 5-1/2" x WOF strips into
(13) 5-1/2" **E** squares

Cut (1) 10-1/2" x WOF strip into
(13) 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" **F** rectangles

Cut (1) 12-1/2" x WOF strip into
(13) 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" **G** rectangles


Cut (1) 13" square twice on the diagonal
for 4 corner triangles

Cut (4) 12-3/4" squares once on the
diagonal for 8 setting triangles



Cut (3) 2" x WOF strips into:
(48) 2" x 2" **H** squares

Cut (6) 2-1/4" x WOF strips for binding



Setting Triangles
12-3/4" squares
Cut once
on the diagonal.




Corner Triangle

Hearts on Point Quilt Instructions

Please read all instructions before you begin. Seam allowance is 1/4". Fabric is abbreviated as 'F' - for example, F1 refers to Fabric 1. Press open unless indicated by arrows.

Heart Top Units

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of all F14-D squares.

2. Place an F14-D square, RST, on the left top corner of a 5-1/2" F1-A square. Sew on the marked line. Trim 1/4" away from the stitched line. Press.

3. Repeat step 2 on the opposite side. Make 2.

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make 2 heart top units each of F2-F13.



Corners

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of all F15-H squares.





2. Place an F15-H square, RST, on one corner of an F14-E square. Sew on the marked line. Trim 1/4" away from the stitched line. Press open. Make 10 and reserve (3) F14-E squares.

3. Place an F15-H square, RST, on the corner of an F14 setting triangle. Sew on the marked line. Trim 1/4" away from the stitched line. Press open. Repeat on the remaining F14 setting triangles.

Heart Blocks

1. Sew an F15-H square to the right side of an F14-F rectangle. Press open. Make 10. Reserve (3) F14-F rectangles.





2. Sew an F15-H square to the left side of an F14-G rectangle. Press open. Make 2.





3. Sew an F15-H square to the right side of an F14-G rectangle. Press open. Make 2.





4. Sew an F15-H square to the right and left sides of an F14-G rectangle. Press open. Make 8. Reserve (1) F14-G rectangle.




5. Arrange the F1 heart units, an F14-E square, and an F1-A square as illustrated to the right. Sew into pairs and then sew the pairs together. Press to nest.



6. Sew a Step 1 F14-F rectangle to the bottom of the heart block. Press.




7. Sew a Step 3 F14-G unit to the side of the heart block. Press.



Heart Blocks


Note: Refer to this diagram for the heart blocks. Some F14-E squares will have a corner and some will not. Same with the rectangles: some will have two corners, some only one, and some none.





Borders

1. Lay out the fabric rectangles as illustrated below.

2. Sew the rectangles together into rows. Press open.

Side Borders measure 2-1/2" x 51-1/2". Make 2.

Quilt Top


1. Lay out the heart blocks, setting triangles, and corner triangles as illustrated below. Sew blocks into rows, pressing as indicated by the arrows.
2. Sew the rows together. Press open. The quilt top should measure 51-1/2" square.
3. Sew the side borders to the sides of the quilt top. Press toward the border.
4. Sew the top and bottom borders to the top/bottom of the quilt top. Press toward the border.



Tip: Pin the borders to the quilt top starting at the center and pinning out to the edge. This will help to make sure you don't stretch the borders as you sew.

Quilt Planning Diagram

Use this diagram to plan your quilt top.



Finishing

1. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste layers to secure. Quilt as desired. Trim the excess backing and batting.
2. Sew the binding strips together into one continuous strip. Press in half length-wise. Sew the binding to the quilt top with a 1/4" seam allowance. Turn the binding to the back side of the quilt and stitch down by hand with matching thread.
